Artist Statement:

Bluebells symbolize constancy, humility and everlasting love. The plant spends most of the year as a bulb underground, only emerging to flower and leaf from April onwards. A carpet of bluebells in full bloom is quite the sight to see on a spring hike. There was a belief that bluebells were used in witches' potions. Others believed that anyone who wanders into a ring of bluebells will fall under fairy enchantment.
